At the end of February 2023 the HBBOE was informed that our local High Bridge Schools would be receiving \$347,749 (~31%) less in State Aid funding in 2023/2024 compared to the previous school year.

The HBBOE President, C. Sharkey, has requested the assistance of the Borough Administration and of Borough Council to communicate this information to the public and to ask the citizens of High Bridge to send letters to our State Senator and Assemblyman to request reconsideration of the State Aid funding.
